

1. The emergency operation is effective at 12:01 am on August 29, 2011. The emergency operation shall expire at 11:59 pm on September 10, 2011 or at the conclusion of the emergency condition described in and pursuant to the attached _____ New York City Department of Sanitation (DSNY) request for emergency operation, (hereinafter, "request") whichever is sooner. The facility operator shall not participate in any emergency operation that continues for more than 21 consecutive days without written authorization from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC).
2. During the emergency operation, the facility operator may accept up to the daily throughput of Putrescible Solid Waste (PSW) specified in the request; however, the facility operator shall not accept more than 1,500 tons per day of PSW. During the emergency operation, the facility operator shall store no more than 2,000 cubic yards of PSW at any one time. Any increase in the subject facility operator's throughput or storage capacity, as defined in its current NYSDEC permit, shall be limited to PSW delivered to the facility operator by DSNY or its authorized representative(s).
3. During the emergency operation, the facility operator shall meet all applicable performance standards (other than throughput and storage capacity limits) found in (a) 6 NYCRR Part 360, (b) its current NYSDEC permit, (c) the Engineering Report and other documentation cited in its current NYSDEC permit, and (d) the State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) Determination(s) pertinent to its subject operation. During the emergency operation, the subject facility may operate 24 hours a day. In addition, the subject facility may operate on any Sunday specified in the attached request.
4. During the emergency operation, the facility operator shall perform all work in a manner that prevents nuisance odors, complies with the truck queuing and parking restrictions set forth in the facility operator's current NYSDEC permit, and otherwise adequately protects life, health, safety, property and the environment.
5. Within two business days following the end of the emergency operation, the facility operator shall fax and e-mail to the NYSDEC's Regional Solid Materials Engineer, a report specifying the date and time the emergency operation commenced and ended, the number of tons of PSW and the number of collection vehicles it received each day of the emergency operation, and how it handled any unexpected or unusual occurrences it experienced during the emergency operation. For not less than seven years, a copy of such report shall be maintained at the subject facility and available for inspection by the Department.
6. Within five business days following the issuance of the instant "Notification of Emergency Operation" and each associated request and report, each such document shall be posted on the facility operator's public web site and maintained thereon for at least two years.
7. Upon inspection of the subject facility, the NYSDEC may decrease the above-listed capacities or otherwise reduce or condition the subject facility's operation under the subject emergency operation. Upon the facility operator's receipt of NYSDEC's written direction, the facility operator shall cease or modify such emergency operation, as so directed.

Dear Mr. Apuzzi:

The New York City Department of Sanitation ("DSNY") is requesting that you open your three IESI facilities on Sunday, September 4, 2011 due to the emergency listed below:

- A. Hurricane Irene hit New York City on August 27 and August 28, 2011 causing significant flooding and power outages.
- B. This event creates this health emergency because of the expected increase of putrescible waste and water damaged furniture and household goods.
- C. Emergency authorization is requested due to the potential unsanitary conditions, i.e., microorganisms, rodents and/or vermin.
- D. The emergency is expected to last from Monday, August 29, 2011 at 12:01AM through Saturday, September 10, 2011 at 11:59 PM.
- E. DSNY has considered alternatives to resolve the emergency. Some alternatives were to increase the number of collection trucks to work simultaneously with the tree hauling operations. This will not work due to the limited number of collection trucks and personnel that DSNY has available for this task and the priority to clear streets of woody debris for emergency vehicles.
- F. DSNY is requesting that IESI opens the following facilities on Sunday, September 4, 2011:
 - IESI – Court Street – 577 Court Street, Brooklyn, NY
 - IESI – 50th Street – 110 50th Street, Brooklyn, NY
 - IESI – Seneca (American Recycling) 172-33 Douglas Ave, Jamaica, NY
